2. Lower Sproul Space

- The new fourth floor will be open space with all of the ASUC sponsored student groups
- Open space doesn't work for our spaces
- Administrators don't know about the
- Working Group meeting is tomorrow – Kirk and David
- They came up with 2 proposals for administration
- First option is to leave the fourth floor open but to get the ground floor for bridges (1100 sq. ft.) 24 hour space. All of the RRCs
 - o Working group cannot guarantee space but the senate can pass a bill saying this is intended for RRCs, etc.
- Second option is moving RRCs in Naia Lounge (about 1200-1300 sq. ft).
- Third Option is moving the RRCs into the bowling alley (which is not a good option for RRCs)
- Basement might be the better option because we could still get the benefits of the new building
- The whole point of this building is for open spaces, according to architects
