

Recycling AT CAL



What can I recycle in the Residence Halls?

Aluminum and Tin: aluminum cans, food cans and lids, aluminum foil

Glass: clear, brown, and green

Plastic Bottles: #1 (PETE) or #2 (HDPE) - rinsed are preferred!

Mixed Paper: YES: white paper, colored paper, magazines, newspaper, brown paper bags, paperback books, junk mail, phone books, etc...

NO: pizza boxes, milk cartons, paper plates or napkins, carbon paper, anything with food contamination!

Cardboard: flattened and without packaging

Where can I recycle in the Residence Halls?

Units 1, 2, and 3:

Mixed paper: Recycling chutes by the elevators

Food and beverage containers: Underneath bathroom sinks - please rinse

Cardboard: Place flattened boxes next to recycling chutes

Beverly Cleary: Recycling rooms on each floor

Clark Kerr: Outside buildings 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, 9, 11, 12, and 19

Foothill: In buildings 2 and 7

Bowles: Outside by the loading dock

Stern: Outside by the trash bins

Manville: Ground floor trash room
