## Why can't monitors be trashed?

Cathode ray tubes (CRTs) are found in most computer monitors and televisionsets and in some camcorders and other electronic devices. CRT glass may contain up to five pounds of lead, a material used to protect us from harmful radiation. Unfortunately, lead is extremely toxic when released into the environment. That is why it is illegal to dispose of devices containing CRTs into the regular trash.

## What else can I recycle?

We know that the end of the year is prime time for dorm cleanups and we're going to prepare accordingly. So, keep your eyes out for the "One Stop Dropoff," your Residence Hall haven for the proper disposal of everything you no longer want. At the One Stop you'll be able to recycle your clothes, readers, lamps, and even your computer monitor. These free services will begin on May 7th and run until May 21st.
