WORDS OF PROFOUND WISDOM and DEEP SPIRITUAL SIGNIFICANCE
USED BY THE PONTIFF IN HIS ADDRESS TO THE UNITED NATIONS

"This is the day which the Lord has made. This is the day we have desired for centuries. A day for the world to remember."

"Gratitude to you; glory to you, who for twenty years have laboured for Peace. Let unanimous trust in this institution grow."

"Your vocation is to make brothers, not only of some, but of all peoples. A difficult undertaking, indeed, but your most noble undertaking."

"Men cannot be brothers if they are not humble. Thus, let no one be superior to the others - never one above the other."

It is pride, no matter how legitimate it may seem to be, that provokes tension and struggles for prestige, for predominance, colonialism. That is, pride disrupts brotherhood."

"We know how ardently you labour to overcome illiteracy and to spread good culture throughout the world; to give man adequate modern medical assistance; to employ to man's service the marvelous resources of science, of technique and of organization. All of this is magnificent. It merits the praise and support of all, including our own."

"The edifice that you have constructed must never fall; it must be perfected and made equal to the needs that world history will present."

"In a word, the edifice of modern civilization must be built on spiritual principles. As Paul has ordained, 'Put on the new man, which, after God, is created in righteousness and true holiness.'"

"Remember the words of Lord Jesus: 'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give unto you.'"

AT YANKEE STADIUM, MONDAY EVENING, OCTOBER 4TH, THE
POPE CELEBRATED THE MASS FOR PEACE, AND ADDRESSED 90,000 PEOPLE

The Pope's salute to America, upon arrival:
"Greetings to you, America. Peace, concord, freedom, justice - and, above all, the vision of life in the hope of immortality. God bless this land of yours."

Rome, Oct. 4 (Reuter)—Pope Paul sent the following message to President Johnson in English as his plane headed across the Atlantic towards New York:
